- Good connections via B29 to Aalen and Stuttgart, or via B290/B19 to Crailsheim, Bad Mergentheim and Würzburg
- Located along the Karlsruhe–Stuttgart–Nuremberg route, with Intercity and regional train connections to Aalen, Ulm and Frankfurt

Churches and Chapels

- A** **Basilica St Vitus**
1233 consecrated and 1737–1741 renovated in baroque style. St Vitus is considered the most important Late Romanesque sacral building in Swabia.
- B** **Evangelische Stadtkirche (Protestant Town Church)**
Former Jesuit Church, built 1724–1729. Prominent frescoes and trompe l'oeil paintings by Christoph Thomas Scheffler.
- C** **Ecumenical door**
A notable feature is the so-called ecumenical door which connects the Protestant Town Church with the catholic Basilica St Vitus.
- D** **Marienkirche (St Mary's Church)**
Gothic Church, built 1427, renovated in baroque style 1753. In the choir a splendid altar made of silver from 1748.
- E** **Wallfahrtskirche Schönenberg (Pilgrimage Church Schoenberg)**
Pilaster church, built to the Vorarlberg Baroque style from 1682–1695 with remarkable interior stucco work.
- F** **Heilig-Geist-Kirche (Church of the Holy Spirit)**
Modern prefabricated church with glass windows by Sieger Köder.
- G** **St Wolfgang's Church**
The church is regarded as one of the most individual creations of the late Gothic period in the Württemberg region and was consecrated in 1476.
- H** **Franziskuskapelle (Chapel of St Francis)**
Artistic furnishings by Sieger Köder.
- I** **Spitalkapelle**
- J** **Methodiuskapelle (Chapel of St Methodius)**
- K** **Sebastianskapelle (Chapel of St Sebastian)**
- L** **Nikolauskapelle (Chapel of St Nicholas)**

Sights

- M** **Market Square with former canons' houses**
- N** **Former townhall**
With artistically forged balcony, now district court.
- O** **Former Jesuit College**
With richly decorated main portal.
- P** **Former postal station "House Zimmerle" (Adler Pharmacy)**
Mozart and Goethe stopped over here. A scene on the richly decorated wall, painted in 1896, brings back these visits to detail.
- Q** **Palais Adelmann**
Built in 1688 by the barons and later counts of Adelmann, today the palais is the arts centre of the town. Garden open in summer.
- R** **Heilig-Geist-Spital (Hospice of the Holy Spirit)**
Today townhall.
- S** **Former Capuchin monastery**
Now "Kinder- und Jugenddorf Marienpflege" (Children's and youth village Marienpflege)
- T** **Schloss ob Ellwangen (Castle)**
The medieval fortress was converted into a four-winged late Renaissance castle in 1603 and served as residence for the Ellwangen Prince Provosts.
- U** **Methodius memorial site**
- V** **Former town mill**
- W** **Fortified tower of the old city wall**
